"(1) To vote for the candidates for president and vice-

president whose names are printed below, record your vote in the

recording of the vote will be counted as a vote for each of the

 manner provided and write the names of your choice for president
 and vice-president under the respective headings provided for
 those offices. Such write-in will be counted as a vote for the
 candidates' presidential electors whose names have been properly
 certified to the secretary of state.
- (3) If you tear, soil, deface, or erroneously mark this ballot, return it to the precinct election officers or, if you cannot return it, notify the precinct election officers, and obtain another ballot."

(B)(1) Below those instructions to the voter shall be printed a single vertical column of enclosed rectangular spaces equal in number to the number of presidential candidates plus one additional space for write-in candidates. Each of those rectangular spaces shall be enclosed by a heavy line along each of its four sides, and such spaces shall be separated from each other by one-half inch of open space.

In each of those enclosed rectangular spaces, except the space provided for write-in candidates, shall be printed the names of the candidates for president and vice-president certified to the secretary of state or nominated in one of the following manners:

- (i) Except as otherwise provided in division (B) (1) (a) (ii) of this section, a political party certifying candidates so nominated shall certify the names of those candidates to the secretary of state in writing on or before the ninetieth day before the day of the general election.
- (ii) If a political party's national convention will not convene in time for the political party to certify the names of the political party's candidates for president and vice-president in accordance with division (B)(1)(a)(i) of this section, then as soon as practicable but not later than the ninetieth day before the day of the general election, the political party shall notify the secretary of state of that fact in writing. The political party then shall certify the names of its nominated candidates for president and vice-president to the secretary of state in writing not later than the seventy-fourth day before the day of the general election or not later than the third day after the close of its national convention, whichever is earlier.
- (2) (b) Nominated by nominating petition in accordance with section 3513.257 of the Revised Code. Such a petition shall be filed on or before the ninetieth day before the day of the general election to provide sufficient time to verify the sufficiency and accuracy of signatures on it.
- (3)—(c) Certified to the secretary of state for placement 75 on the presidential ballot by authorized officials of a minor 76 political party that has held a state or national convention for 77 the purpose of choosing those candidates or that may, without a 78

convention, certify those candidates in accordance with the	79
procedure authorized by its party rules. The	80
